- 2. Speeches should be within the following time by grade. Note cards may be used. Five points will be deducted if under or over the allotted time. Times listed are Hamblen County contest requirements.
 - a. 4^{th} Grade -1-3 minutes
 - b. 5^{th} Grade -3-5 minutes
- 3. Topic for speeches: Select a US President who served between 1789-1990 and tell us about his impact on the history of the United States.

Things to consider:

What were his years of service? What good things did he accomplish? What mistakes did he make? Were there any major wars during his service? What was the impact of his actions? How did his private life impact him as a President? Any other interesting information.

- 4. Ribbons will be awarded in each club (purple, blue, red or white)
- 5. A portion of the top speeches will be invited to the county contest to compete in their grade level.

Speech Guidelines

A good speech will have three main parts – introduction, body and conclusion.

- 1. INTRODUCTION tells the audience what you are going to talk about
- 2. BODY informs the audience while you explain something to the listeners. It can be like a story or report.
- 3. CONCLUSION the end of your speech. Remind you listeners of the main points so they will remember your speech and why it was important.
