- 2. Speeches should be within the following time by grade. Note cards may be used. Five points will be deducted if under or over the allotted time.
 - a. 6th-8th Grade 5-7 minutes
 - b. 9th-12th Grade 5-7 minutes
- 3. Topic for speeches:
 - a. 6^{th} - 8^{th} Grade Any school appropriate topic or the impact 4-H has had on you.
 - b. 9th-12th Grade The impact 4-H has had on you.
- 4. Ribbons will be awarded in each club (purple, blue or red)
- 5. A portion of the top speeches will be invited to the county contest to compete in their grade level.

Speech Guidelines

A good speech will have three main parts – introduction, body and conclusion.

- 1. INTRODUCTION tells the audience what you are going to talk about
- 2. BODY informs the audience while you explain something to the listeners. It can be like a story or report.
- 3. CONCLUSION the end of your speech. Remind you listeners of the main points so they will remember your speech and why it was important.
