Public Speaking is an important part of daily communication. Show your skills in the public speaking contest. Your speech is due on

Rules are as follows:

- ✓ Topic: Select a US President, who served between 1789-1990, and tell us about his impact on the history of the United States.
 - ✓ Things to consider (not limited to these)
 - ✓ What were his years of service?
 - ✓ What good things were accomplished?
 - ✓ What mistakes were made?
 - ✓ Were there any battles or wars?
 - ✓ What impact did he have?
 - ✓ How did his private life impact him as President?
 - ✓ Any other interesting information
- ✓ Speeches do not have to be memorized. Note cards may be used.
- ✓ Speeches should be within the following time limits by grade.
 - ✓ 4th Grade 1-3 minutes
 - ✓ 5th Grade 3-5 minutes
- ✓ Points will be deducted if the speech is too short or too long.
- ✓ Ribbons will be awarded in each classroom (purple, blue, red or white).
- ✓ Purple ribbons will be invited to the County Contest.
- ✓ White ribbons mean that you did not follow directions (ex/wrong) topic, way too long or short).
- ✓ All good speeches have an introduction, body and conclusion.


4-H Piggy Bank Pageant

America Saves is a program designed to help youth learn the importance of financial health and saving money. By creating your own piggy bank you can start saving towards a goal of your own. Piggy banks will be due at the next 4-H activity on

Rules are as follows:

- Piggy banks must be made by an individual youth.
- Piggy banks do not have to be in the shape of a pig.
- ✓ Piggy banks must have an opening to put money in and a way to take money out without breaking or destroying it.
- Only one entry per member.
- ✓ Piggy banks should be made from recycled materials. Do NOT use anything
- Use any supplies you want! (paint, sequins, paper, stickers) but NO GLITTER.
- You cannot simply buy a bank and decorate it.
- Piggy banks can be no bigger than 12 in x 12 in x 12 in.
- Be sure to label your pig with your name, teacher, grade and school.

It's important to save money so you can buy or do the things you want in the future. Use your creativity to make a Piggy Bank to hold the money you save!
