Volunteer Position Description Shooting Sports Certified Instructor Position Description

Objectives:

Responsible for teaching discipline related skills to 4-H'ers.

Discipline areas: Archery, Rifle, Shotgun, Black Powder, or Hunting

Supervision:

Tennessee 4-H Shooting Sports Coordinator and Hamblen County 4-H Agent

Responsibilities:

- Teach shooting safety.
- Coordinate dates, times and location for project sessions with co-instructors, shooting sports coordinator, and 4-H Agent.
- > Instruct and coach members on proper shooting techniques.
- > Attend shooting club meeting and activities.
- Recruit and train assistant instructors.
- > Assist coordinator in securing needed equipment and facilities.
- > Record and report project club membership & participation on forms provided.
- Recruit parents and 4-H members.
- > Participate in training programs specified by the shooting sports committee.
- > Be familiar with local, county, region & state events and activities supporting project.
- Promote other 4-H activities and events.
- > In charge of any live-fire events.
- Encourage and assist 4-H members in completing project materials, achievement project portfolios, Academic Conference & Honor Club applications, etc.
- > Request training help or other assistance as needed.
- Conduct should model the Six Pillars of Character, trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship.

Qualifications:

- > Age 21 or older
- Ability to work with youth and adults
- Interest in and knowledge of shooting sports
- > State certification in shooting disciplines, recertification as required
- Familiar with 4-H objectives and philosophy or willing to learn

Resources Available:

- > TN State Shooting Sports Level 1 Instructor Training

- University of Tennessee resources, including 4-H specialists and staff, as well as program development material, and SUPER enrollment data management program.
- 4-H volunteer liability coverage for registered volunteers is provided by the University of Tennessee.

Time Commitment:

- Flexible, with a minimum of weekly sessions planned for two or more hours each during the "season".
- Preparation time, also flexible as determined by session plans, training needed, and knowledge of subject.
- Shooting Sports Instructors will serve for two years with the understanding that if local leaders and extension staff are in agreement, he/she may continue serving in this position.

Steps to becoming a Shooting Sports Certified Instructor:

- Contact Elizabeth Hobbs to discuss your interest and Volunteer Leader Level (1, 2 or 3)
- Complete 4-H Volunteer Leader Application Process
 - <u>Volunteerism | Extension Human Resources, Evaluation, and Staff</u> <u>Development (tennessee. edu)</u>
 - Complete Steps 3-8. On Step 3 complete designated Volunteer level.
 Completed forms should be printed and signed.
- Submit completed forms and valid government ID to Hamblen County 4-H Agent – Elizabeth Hobbs.
- Complete the discipline specific Level 1 Instructor training online prior to attending an inperson training.
- > In-person trainings are in August, November and January.
