The What:

What do my chicks/pullets need? Chicks/pullets are 1-3 days old at pick-up. They will need a nesting box and brooder lamp. They will need a feeder and waterer. As they get older and can move outside they will need a chicken coop or other area to be kept safe from predators.

What does it cost? There are multiple costs to the chick chain.

- 1. Purchase cost -\$20 for 6 chicks or \$35 for 12 chicks/pullets
 - 2. Equipment costs –Vary based on the items used
- 3. Feed costs –Vary based on the feeds being fed. One chick/pullet will consume an average 25 lbs of feed during the time you receive them and the county show and sale.

What are the requirements? You should provide your chicks/pullets with shelter, water and feed them a balanced ration. You should also keep good records of the project until the chicks/pullets are sold.

What is the Show? This is an opportunity for you to bring 3 or 6 (based on purchase quantity) of your chicks/pullets back and see how well you did raising them compared to the others in the project. Awards will be given based on the color ribbon that your chicks/pullets receive during the show.

What do I do with my chicks/pullets after the show? All birds are yours to keep. You will take your birds home after the show.

What kind of records do I keep? You will be provided with a Record Book to keep information about your expenses, daily care and special needs that your chicks/pullets have during the duration of the project.

What recognition do I get? During the show your pullets will receive a ribbon. After the show your record book will be reviewed and awarded a ribbon. Prize money will be given for both the pullets and the record book.
